Course Mode: This is an **online** course. Classroom time is replaced by content and activities that take place in a managed online classroom (Canvas). However, the contact hours are flexible and assignments and communication can take place at home or anyplace with a computer and Internet access. This online class does not require campus visits. ASSIGNMENTS AND GRADING

Instruction/Assessment: Once a week (Thursday Mornings) a new week of assignments becomes available on the Human Relations in Organizations blackboard site. There is always a text reading assignment. I will provide my instructor overview of each chapter assigned (my online version of a lecture), and once in awhile notes on additional topics. Each week you will have three "deliverables", or work that you receive points for: class discussion, quiz, written assignment or related projects that will involve a written report. The specific assignments will be posted by me in Weekly Maps and available to students each Thursday morning.

The *approximate* points available for this course and the *tentative* distribution of these points is:

Assignments: 8 @ 5 points = 40 points

Midterm & Final Assignments: 2 @ 20 points = 40 points

Discussions: 10 @ 6 points each = 60 points Quizzes: 10 @ 10 points each = 100 points

Late Work: Assignments, quizzes, and weekly discussions must be completed during the class week, due by Wednesday at midnight—they **cannot be made up**. You, as a student,

are solely responsible for identifying, completing, and turning in all of your work.
